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01 About This Manual

Stopline Trade Manager MT5 (in this manual: the EA) is an Expert Advisor for MetaTrader 5 that places and manages your own trades. You decide the direction, the stop loss and the target; the EA calculates the lot from the risk you choose, sends the order and then manages the position with partial closes, breakeven and a trailing stop if you want them. It gives no signals and does not open trades by itself.

This manual describes version 1.00. It covers the installation, a quick start, every tab of the panel control by control, the objects the EA draws on the chart, the automatic management functions, hotkeys, presets and statistics, and it ends with troubleshooting, a glossary and the complete list of inputs.

02 Installation

Stopline Trade Manager MT5 is sold and rented on the MQL5 Market only. The terminal downloads and installs a Market product by itself, so there are no files to copy.

2.1 Requirements

- MetaTrader 5, logged in to a trading account (demo or real, at any broker, with hedging or netting); on a Mac, MetaTrader 5 for macOS (Section 2.11).
- An MQL5.community account (free registration at mql5.com), which is needed to buy, rent and install products from the Market.
- Algo Trading allowed in the terminal (see Section 2.4).

2.2 Link Your MQL5 Account

Open **Tools > Options** (**Ctrl** + **O**) and select the **Community** tab. The terminal uses this account to download what you buy or rent.

- If you already have an MQL5.community account, click **If you have an account, please login** (highlighted in the figure below), enter your login and password and press **OK**.
- Without an account, enter the login you want and your e-mail address and press **Register**. The password is sent to that e-mail address; enter it with your login as described above.

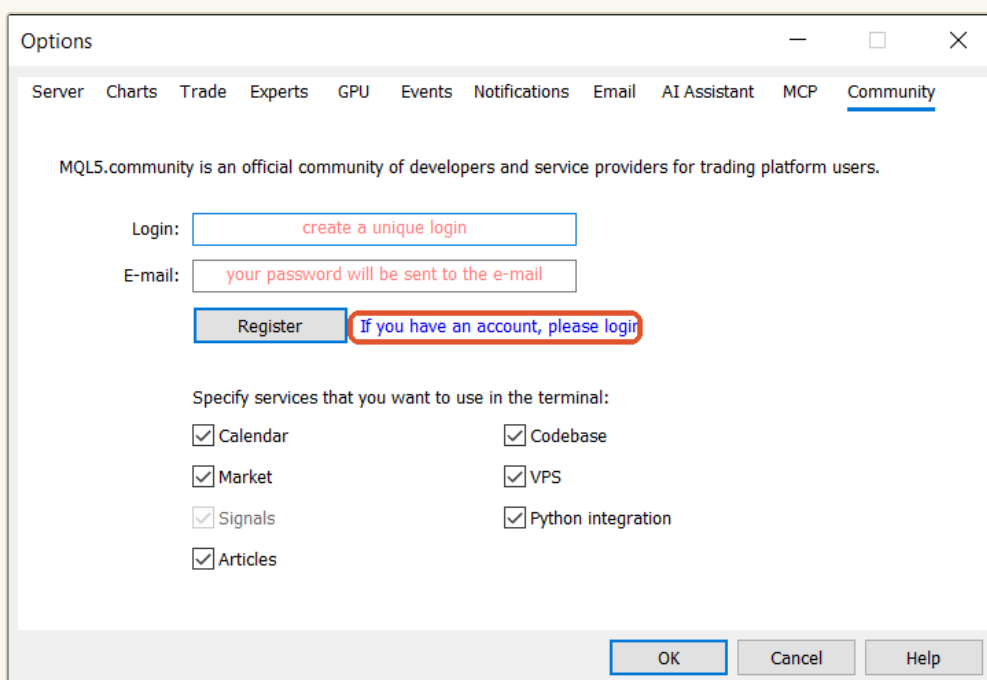


FIGURE 1 The Community tab of Tools > Options, with the link to the login form highlighted

2.3 Buy or Rent the EA

You can buy or rent the EA in either of two places:

- In the terminal: open the **Toolbox** (**Ctrl** + **T**), select its **Market** tab, search for *Stopline Trade Manager* and press **Buy or Rent**.
- On the product page at mql5.com, logged in with the same MQL5.community account.

As soon as the payment is complete, the terminal downloads the EA into the folder `MQL5\Experts\Market\`. Each purchase includes the number of activations shown on the product page. An activation binds the EA to the computer on which it was installed (its hardware and operating system), not to a trading account: on that computer you can use the EA with any account at any broker.

2.4 Enable Algo Trading

An Expert Advisor can send orders only while **Algo Trading** is enabled. Press the **Algo Trading** button on the toolbar (or **Ctrl** + **E**); it shows a green triangle when Algo Trading is on.

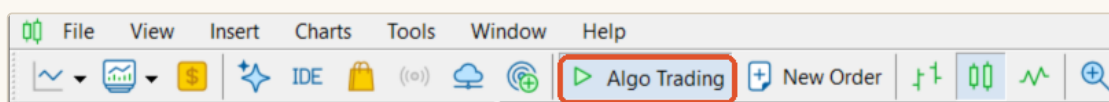


FIGURE 2 The Algo Trading button on the toolbar

2.5 Find the EA in the Navigator

Open the **Navigator** (**View** > **Navigator** or **Ctrl** + **N**) and expand **Expert Advisors** > **Market**. The EA is listed as **Stopline Trade Manager MT5**.

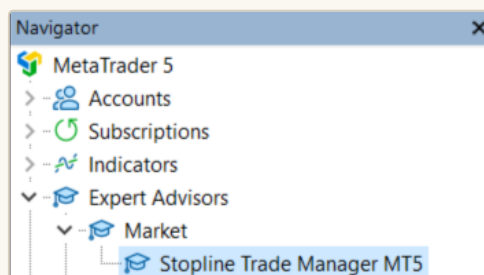


FIGURE 3 The EA under Expert Advisors > Market in the Navigator

2.6 Attach the EA to a Chart

Open a chart of the symbol you want to trade and drag **Stopline Trade Manager MT5** from the Navigator onto the chart, or double-click it. The EA dialog opens. A chart runs one Expert Advisor at a time; open one chart per symbol, or see *Manage all symbols* in Section 12.3.

2.7 Review the EA Dialog

The dialog has two tabs. You can open it again at any time with **F7** while the chart is active.

On the **Common** tab, tick **Allow Algo Trading**. Without it the EA runs and draws its panel and lines, but every order is refused and the health dot of the panel turns amber (see Section 4.1).

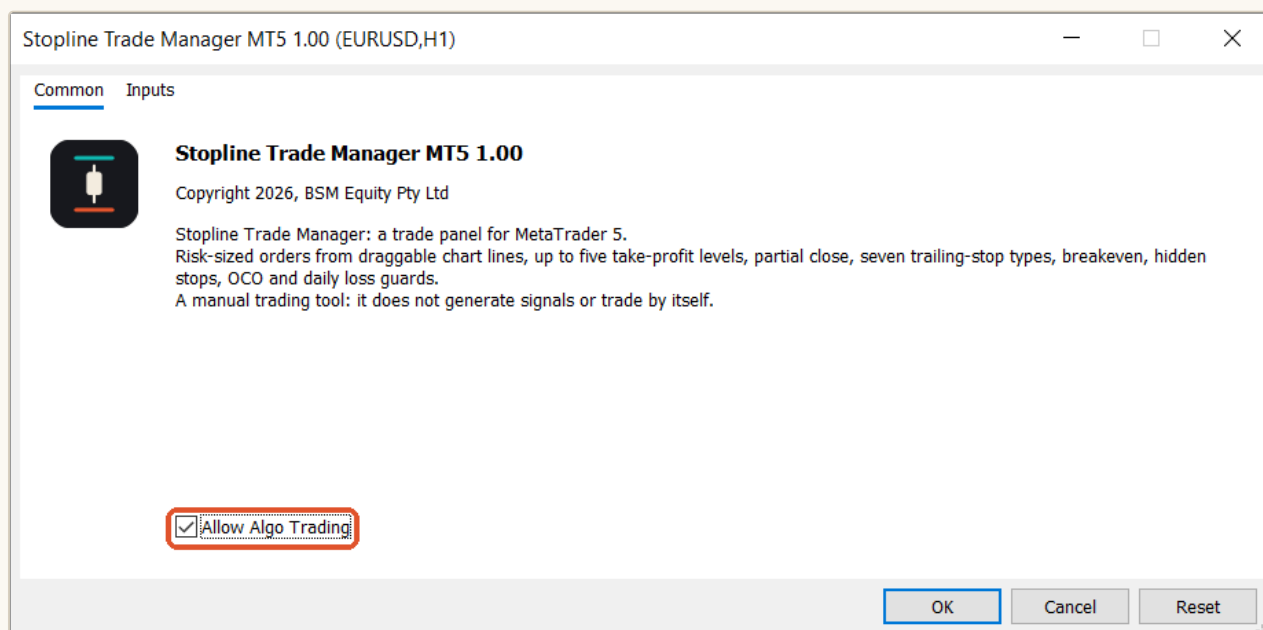


FIGURE 4 The Common tab: tick Allow Algo Trading

The **Inputs** tab lists the starting value of every setting. You rarely need to change them here: almost every setting can be changed later on the panel, and the panel remembers your changes per symbol (see Chapter 17). Appendix A lists all inputs. Press **OK** to start the EA.

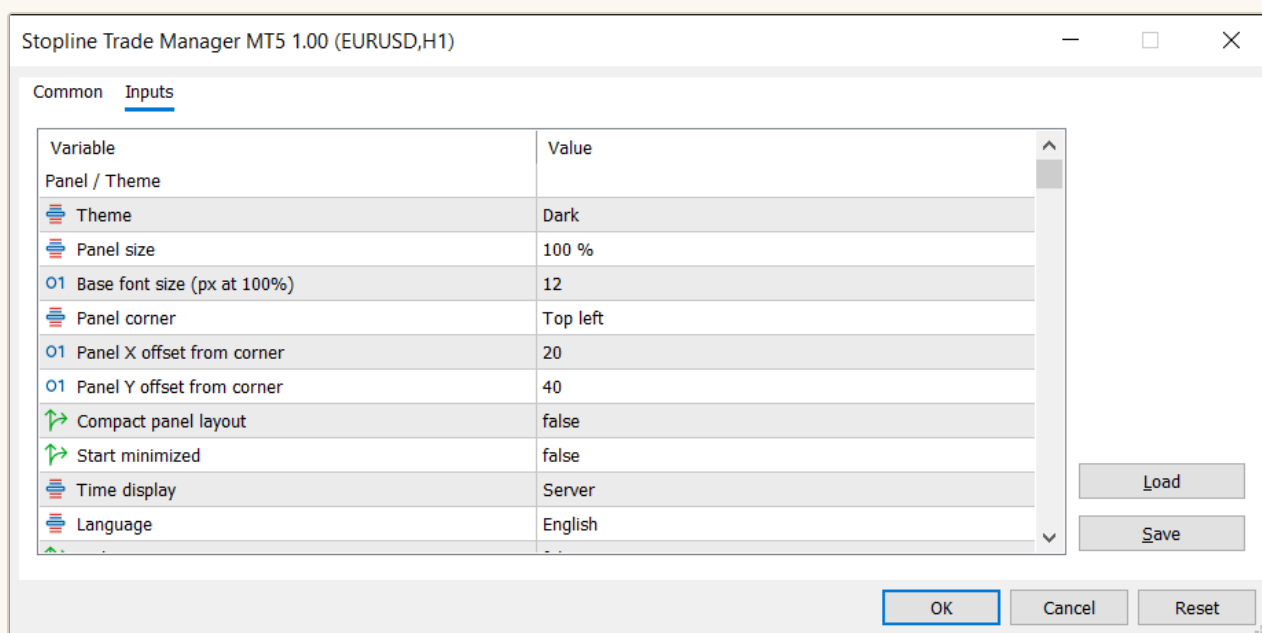


FIGURE 5 The Inputs tab with the first input group, Panel / Theme

2.8 Check That the EA Is Running

The name of the EA appears in the top-right corner of the chart with a hat icon, which is blue while Algo Trading is allowed, and the panel opens on the **Trade** tab.

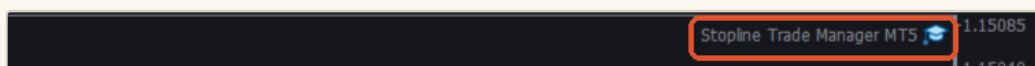


FIGURE 6 The chart corner while the EA is running

2.9 Install on Another Computer

Link the same MQL5.community account on the other computer (Section 2.2), open the **Market** tab of the **Toolbox**, select **Purchased** and press **Install** next to the EA. Each installation on a new computer uses one activation. Reinstalling the operating system or changing the hardware also counts as a new computer.

2.10 Updates and Removal

Updates of a purchased product are free. When a new version is available, the **Purchased** section of the **Market** tab offers an **Update** button next to the EA. Your settings, presets and trade journal are kept, because the EA stores them in its data folder (see Chapter 22).

To remove the EA from a chart, right-click the chart, select **List of Expert Advisors**, select the EA and remove it. Attaching another Expert Advisor to the chart also replaces it.

2.11 On a Mac

MetaQuotes provides MetaTrader 5 for macOS (macOS 10.15.7 Catalina or later, Intel and Apple silicon). Download the installer from metatrader5.com or from your broker and run it: it sets up everything the platform needs by itself. Agree when it asks to install additional packages (Mono, Gecko). The terminal is the same program as on any other computer, so every step of this chapter is the same. A few things differ:

- **Keys:** MetaTrader's shortcuts use the Control key, not Command: **Ctrl** + **E** is Control and E. The function keys usually need **Fn**, so the EA dialog opens with **Fn** + **F7**, unless the macOS keyboard settings use F1, F2 and so on as standard function keys.
- **Right-click:** click with two fingers on the trackpad, or hold Control and click.

- **Data folder:** in Finder, choose **Go > Go to Folder** and enter
`~/Library/Application Support/net.metaquotes.wine.metatrader5/drive_c/Program Files/MetaTrader 5`; the EA's folders (Chapter 22) are in `MQL5/Files` inside it.
- **Fonts:** the panel is designed with Segoe UI, which a Mac does not have. The EA then uses Tahoma, which MetaTrader brings along (for Chinese and Japanese a Mac font such as PingFang or Hiragino), so the text looks slightly different; the **Experts** tab says so when the EA starts.
- **Activations:** each Mac counts as one computer (Section 2.9).

03 Quick Start: A Risk-Sized Trade in Under a Minute

This chapter places a market order with the default settings. The figure below shows the panel and its lines right after the EA starts.



FIGURE 7 The panel and its lines on the chart (Dark theme, the default)

1. **Attach the EA.** The panel opens on the **Trade** tab with **LC** (Lot Calc) on: the lot is calculated from the **Risk** field (1% of the balance by default) and the distance to the stop loss (SL). The entry line (blue-grey), the stop-loss line (orange) and the take-profit line (teal) are drawn on the chart. On a fresh start the SL and TP lines are placed at 15% and 30% of the visible price range, so they are easy to reach.
2. **Set the risk and the stop.** Type a risk and a stop distance, or move the SL and TP lines on the chart: point at a line and drag the tab that appears (Section 6.1). The line labels and the summary line below the fields show the lot, the risk in money and in percent, the reward and the reward-to-risk ratio (RR).
3. **Press BUY or SELL.** The lines show one direction. The button for the other direction first flips the lines (the stop loss and the take profit change sides); the next press sends the order. A confirmation lists every detail: **Enter** confirms, **Esc** cancels. To skip the confirmation, tick **Don't ask again** or turn on **One-click trading** in the **Settings** tab.
4. **To place a pending order instead,** drag the entry line away from the price (the order type follows automatically) or choose the type in the drop-down list, then press **PLACE**. While a pending type is selected, **BUY** and **SELL** are unavailable, so a market order cannot be sent by mistake. Set the type back to **Market** (or press **M**) to trade at market again.
5. **To take profit in steps,** press **+TP**. A row with a distance, a share of the lot and a remove button (x) appears below the SL and TP fields, and a dotted TP1 line appears on the chart. Up to five levels are possible (see Section 5.4).

These five steps are all a trade needs. The following chapters describe the other tabs and the automatic functions: partial close, trailing stop, breakeven and virtual orders.

04 The Panel

4.1 Header

The header shows the state of the EA and gives access to the tabs.

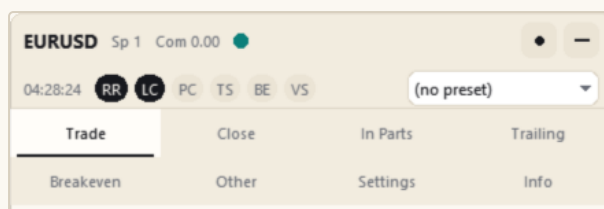


FIGURE 8 The header: symbol, spread, commission, health dot; clock, function chips and presets; the tabs (Light theme)

The first row shows the symbol, the spread in points (**Sp**), the commission per lot (**Com**) and the health dot:

- Teal: the EA is ready to trade.
- Amber: Algo Trading is off (on the toolbar or in the EA dialog), or the last trade request failed.
- Orange: the terminal has no connection to the trade server, or the daily loss limit has been reached.

The second row shows the clock (server time, local time, both, or GMT: the **Time** setting in the **Settings** tab), the function chips (Section 4.2) and the preset drop-down list, which loads a saved preset with one click.

Two buttons sit at the right of the first row: the dot switches between the light and the dark theme, and the minus sign minimizes the panel to a toolbar (Section 4.5). With **Symbol switch** on (**Settings** tab), two arrows switch to the previous or next Market Watch symbol. Drag the first row to move the panel; the position is saved.

4.2 Function Chips

The chips light up for the functions that new positions will receive.

Chip	Meaning
RR	Risk/reward link: the take profit follows the stop loss at the ratio R/TP : R/SL.
LC	Lot calculation: the lot is calculated from the risk and the stop distance.
PC	Partial close: new positions receive the levels of the In Parts tab.
TS	Trailing stop: new positions are trailed with the settings of the Trailing tab.
BE	Automatic breakeven: new positions move their stop to breakeven at the set level.
VS	Virtual stops or virtual pending orders: levels kept by the EA, not sent to the broker.

4.3 Tooltips

Rest the mouse pointer on a button, switch or drop-down list for half a second and a short hint explains it, abbreviations included, in the language of the panel. An unavailable (greyed-out) control explains why it is unavailable. The **Tooltips** switch in the **Settings** tab (input `Inp_Panel_Tooltips`) turns the hints off.

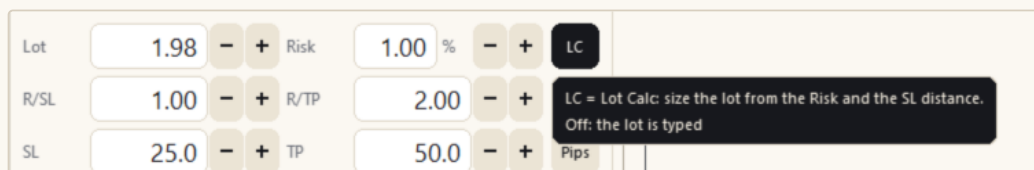


FIGURE 9 A tooltip explaining the LC button

4.4 Size, Scrolling and Themes

Drag the grip in the bottom-right corner of the panel to resize it: the width rearranges every tab and the height sets a maximum. The panel never grows taller than the chart; when a tab does not fit, scroll it with the mouse wheel, the scroll bar in the right margin or **Tab** (Section 4.6). Drag the height past the content to return to “fit the content”. **Scale** (75%, 100%, 125% or 150%) and **Font** in the **Settings** tab change the size of every element; the panel also follows the display scaling of your screen.

There are four themes and a **High contrast** switch that works with each of them. Light (warm paper) and Dark (ink) use the colors of this manual; Slate (a cool light grey) and Midnight (navy) are their cool counterparts. Dark is the default. The colors mean the same thing in every theme, as in the Stopline logo: teal is buy, the take profit and profit; orange is sell, the stop loss and loss.

4.5 Minimized Toolbar

The minus button in the header (or **M**) reduces the panel to one row with the essential buttons: **BUY**, **SELL**, **PLACE**, **Close** (every position of the symbol), **Lines**, **Shot** (screenshot) and **N** (new order: show or hide the lines). The plus button restores the full panel. The input `Inp_Panel_StartMinimized` starts the panel in this form.

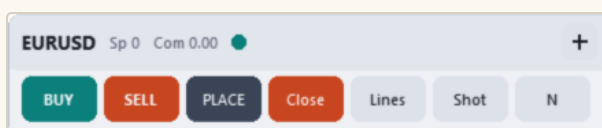


FIGURE 11 The minimized toolbar (Slate theme)

4.6 Keyboard Field Navigation

MetaTrader does not let an Expert Advisor give the keyboard focus to an input field, so the panel provides its own navigation: **Tab** highlights the next field (with an accent border), **NumPlus** and **NumMinus** change it by one step, exactly like its spin buttons, and **Esc** removes the highlight. Click a field to type into it; **Enter** applies the value. Hotkeys do not work while an input field has the keyboard focus.

05 Trade Tab

The **Trade** tab plans and sends an order. The plan is visible twice, in the fields and on the chart as lines, and both always show the same values.

5.1 Controls

5.2 Pending and Stop-Limit Orders

Drag the entry line above or below the market and the order type follows: above the price a buy becomes a Buy Stop, below it a Buy Limit, and the sell orders mirror this. For a stop-limit order, choose the type in the drop-down list and set **Lim**; a dotted line shows the limit price. **BUY** and **SELL** remain unavailable while a pending type is selected; rest the pointer on them to read why.

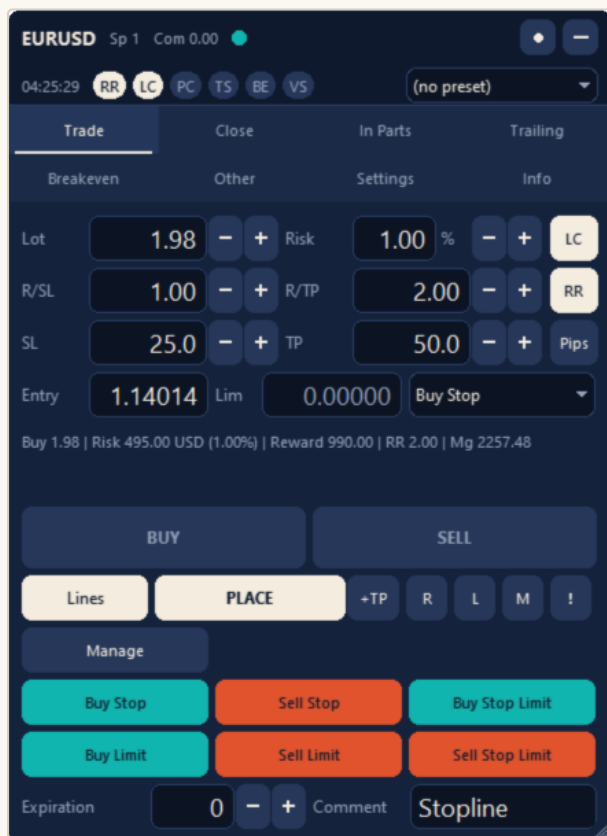


FIGURE 13 A Buy Stop planned with the lines (Midnight theme)

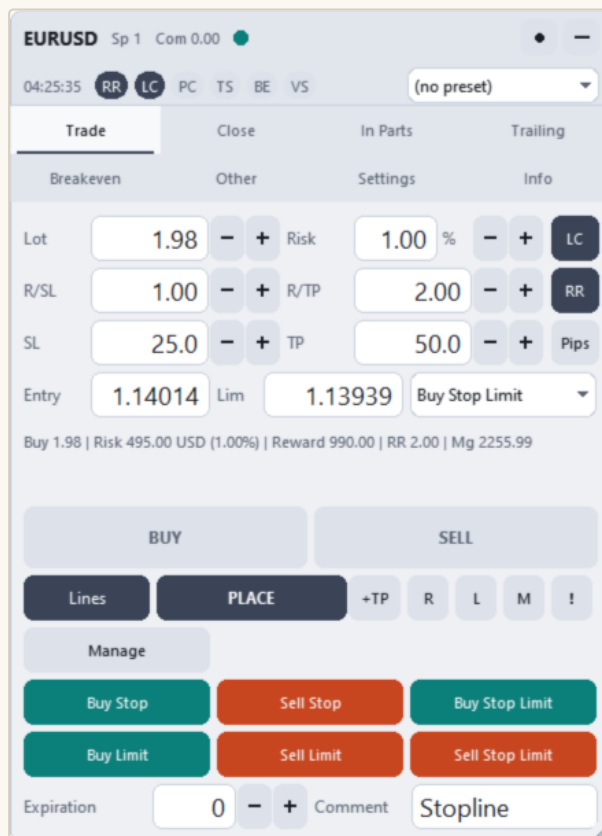


FIGURE 14 A Buy Stop Limit with its Lim price (Slate theme)

5.3 Order Confirmation

Before a market order is sent, the confirmation lists the direction, lot, entry, stop loss and take profit (as prices and in pips), the risk and reward in money, the RR, the margin and the spread. **Enter** or **BUY / SELL** sends the order; **Esc** or **Cancel** cancels it. **Don't ask again** turns on one-click trading; the **One-click trading** switch in the **Settings** tab turns it off again. **Confirm close** in the **Settings** tab (input `Inp_Trade_ConfirmClose`) asks before positions are closed.

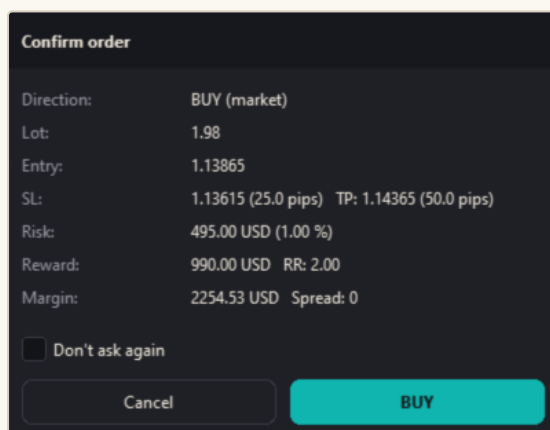


FIGURE 15 The order confirmation (Dark theme)

5.4 Take-Profit Levels

+TP adds a row with a distance (or a price in **Price** mode), a share of the lot and a remove button (x) below the SL and TP fields, and a dotted TP1 line on the chart. Type the distance or move the line; the share says how much of the position closes at that level, and whatever remains runs to the final take profit. Press **+TP** again for TP2, TP3 and so on, up to five levels. The levels are kept in order, the nearest first.

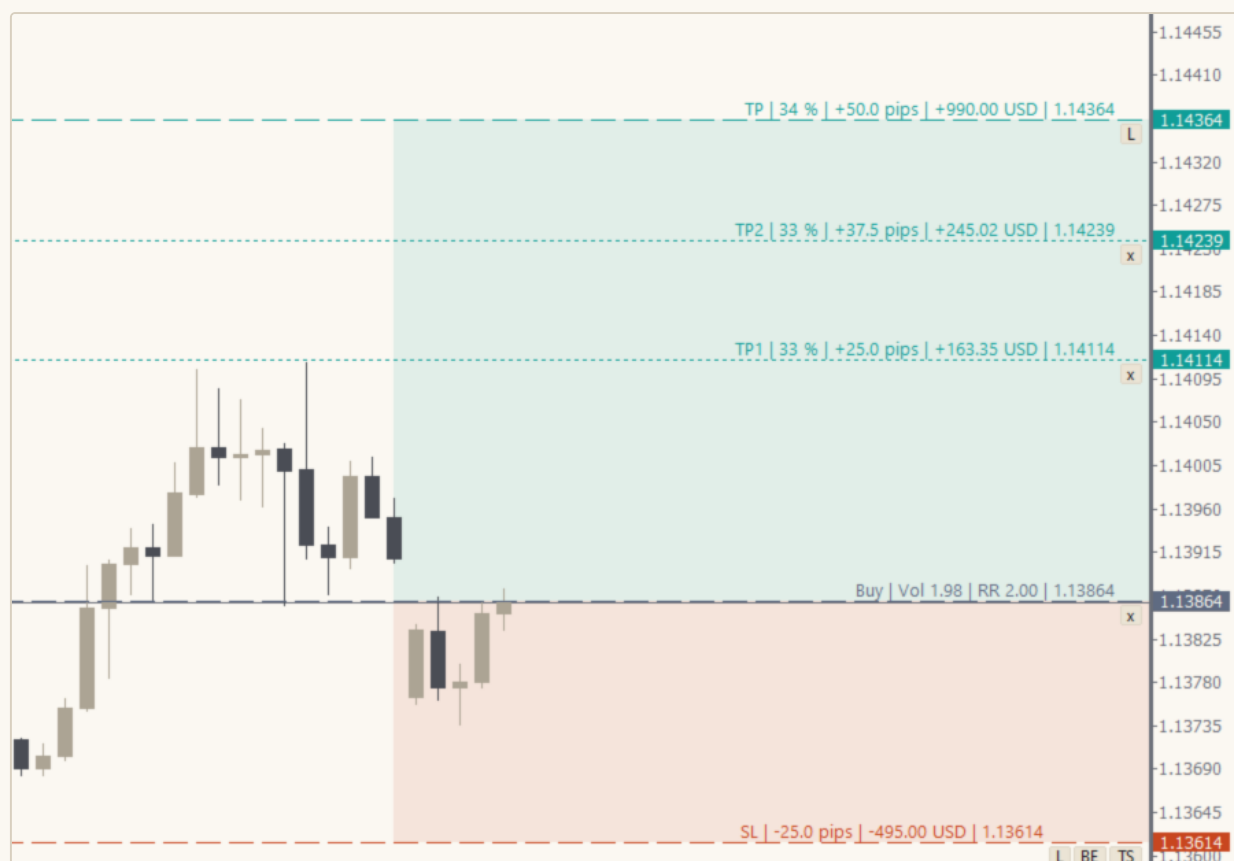


FIGURE 17 The dotted take-profit lines on the chart, each with the share of the lot it closes

A position keeps the levels it was opened with. They are drawn as dotted `TP1 #ticket` lines that you can move per position, and changing the panel later never changes a running trade. Pending and virtual pending orders keep their levels until they are filled. A position with its own take-profit levels uses them instead of the levels of the **In Parts** tab.

5.5 Manage Mode: Acting on Selected Positions

Manage replaces the pending-order buttons with position management buttons and lists the open positions of the chart symbol, each with a tick box, its ticket, side, lot, entry price and live profit or loss. Up to ten positions are listed; with more open, a line below the list says how many more there are, and you select those on the chart.

The buttons act on the ticked positions. With nothing ticked they act on every position of the chart symbol. **Select all** ticks every listed position. A scope line above the list states what the buttons will act on, for example *Scope: 2 of 5 positions selected*.

You can also select a position on the chart: Ctrl+click its position label (the label turns to the accent color and shows [x]), or choose **Select for the Manage buttons** in its position menu (Section 6.3). Both methods change the same selection as the tick boxes. The selection is not saved; it only applies to the next actions.

The selection applies to these actions wherever you start them: the matching buttons of the **Close** tab (**Close Buy**, **Close Sell**, **Close All**, **Close Profit**, **Close Loss** and **Close %**), **Breakeven now** on the **Breakeven** tab, and their hotkeys. In the **Apply to** list of the **In Parts**, **Trailing**, **Breakeven** and **Settings** tabs, **Selected position** uses the ticked positions.

06 Chart Objects

The EA draws its lines, labels and buttons on the chart. This chapter explains how to move them and what each one means.

6.1 Moving a Line

Point at the line you want to move. As soon as the pointer is close to it, a small tab in the line's color appears under the pointer with the line's name (**Entry**, **SL**, **TP**, **TP2**, **P1**, **Alert** and so on), and the line is drawn thicker, so you can see which line you are about to take even on a busy chart. Press on the tab and drag it: the line follows the pointer and the

tab shows the price, for a stop loss or take profit also the distance from the entry in pips. While you drag the entry, stop-loss or take-profit line, the lot, the risk and the reward on the panel and the line labels follow the pointer. Release the mouse button to place the line.

This works for every line the EA draws for you to move: the entry, stop loss and take profit, the take-profit levels, the partial-close levels, the take-profit levels of a position, hidden stops, virtual orders, the automatic cancellation line and alert lines. The lines of open positions, virtual orders and alerts take their new price when you release the button.

If a line cannot go where you release it, for example a stop loss above the entry of a buy, it returns to where it was and a message explains why. For the stop loss and the take profit the tab already turns into an orange outline while the pointer is at such a price.

The tab does not appear over the panel, over a position label or over the small buttons at the right end of a line, so they stay easy to click. A press on the tab of the entry, stop-loss or take-profit line without moving it selects that line for the keys described below. The input `Inp_Lines_Grips` turns the tab off.

The usual MetaTrader method works as well: double-click a line to select it (small square markers appear), drag it, and double-click it again to deselect it. If you prefer a single click, turn on **Select objects by single mouse click** in **Tools > Options > Charts**; the terminal then selects every object with one click.

You can also move a line without the mouse: **Q** selects the next line of the plan, **Shift + Up** and **Shift + Down** move it by one step, and **Shift + L**, **Shift + T** and **Shift + P** place the stop loss, the take profit or the entry at the mouse pointer. The small buttons on the lines (**L**, **x**, **BE**, **TS**) and the position labels react to a single click.

6.2 The Planning Lines

- **Entry** (blue-grey), **SL** (orange) and **TP** (teal), with shaded zones between them (input `Inp_Lines_RangeShow`; further inputs draw the zones across the full chart width or behind the price).
- The labels show what the *Label* inputs select: the direction, volume, price, pips, profit or loss in money and in percent, RR, net RR, spread, commission and margin. The input `Inp_Lines_FontSize` sets their size.
- A line stays exactly where you release it, and the panel follows.
- **RR lock** (the **RR** button on): moving the SL line moves the TP line and the other way round, so the ratio holds. A locked line (**L**) keeps its price and the ratio follows instead. With RR off the lines are independent.
- **Magnet** (**M** or **G**) returns the entry line to the market price. With **Entry line follows the market price** on (the default, `Inp_Lines_AlwaysMarket`) it stays there.
- Moving the entry line away from the market turns the plan into the matching pending order type.
- Buttons on the lines: **L** on the TP line locks the take profit and **L** on the SL line locks the stop loss; **x** on the entry line hides the lines; **BE** and **TS** on the SL line turn automatic breakeven and trailing on or off for the next position.

6.3 Position Labels and the Position Menu

Each open position of the chart symbol has a label on its entry line, for example `#ticket BUY 0.10 +12.30 USD`. Click the label to open the position menu; Ctrl+click it to select or deselect the position for the Manage buttons (Section 5.5).

6.4 Other Objects

- **Partial-close level lines** of each position (movable) and the **breakeven activation line**.
- **Virtual SL and TP lines** (`vSL #ticket` , `vTP #ticket`) of hidden stops (movable).
- **Virtual pending orders**: movable lines; x deletes one.
- The **automatic cancellation level** and the **stop-out line** (input `Inp_Lines_StopOut`).
- **Expiration markers** of pending orders: vertical dotted lines at the expiry time.
- **Alert lines** (amber, dashed): see Chapter 14.

The EA only deletes its own objects (their names start with `TA<chart id>_`); lines that you draw yourself are never touched.

07 Close Tab

The **Close** tab closes positions and deletes pending orders in groups. When positions are ticked in Manage mode (Section 5.5), **Close Buy**, **Close Sell**, **Close All**, **Close Profit**, **Close Loss** and **Close %** act on the ticked positions only.

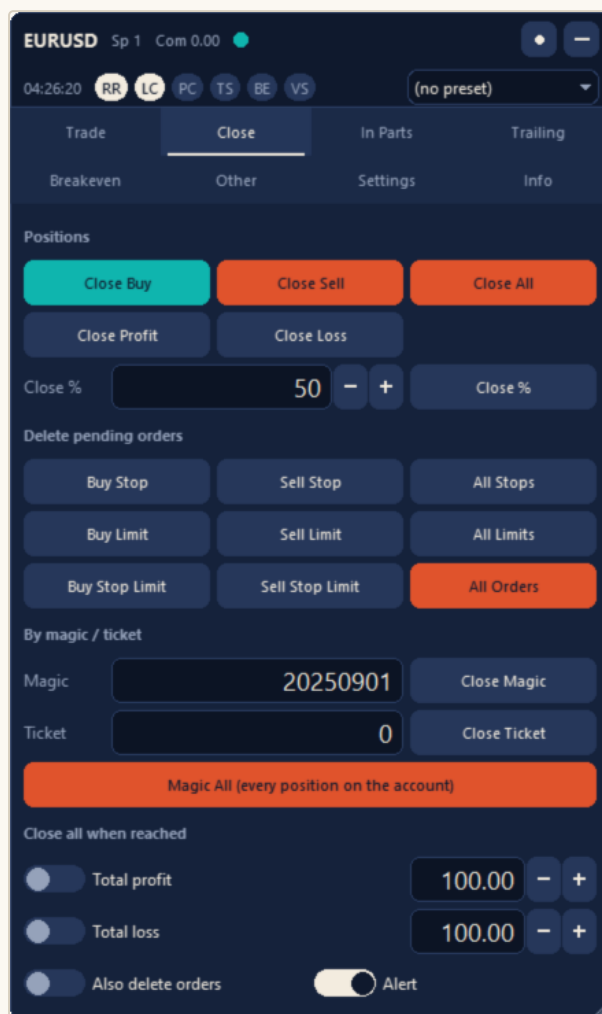


FIGURE 22 The Close tab (Midnight theme)

08 In Parts Tab

The **In Parts** tab splits new orders into several positions and closes positions in steps.

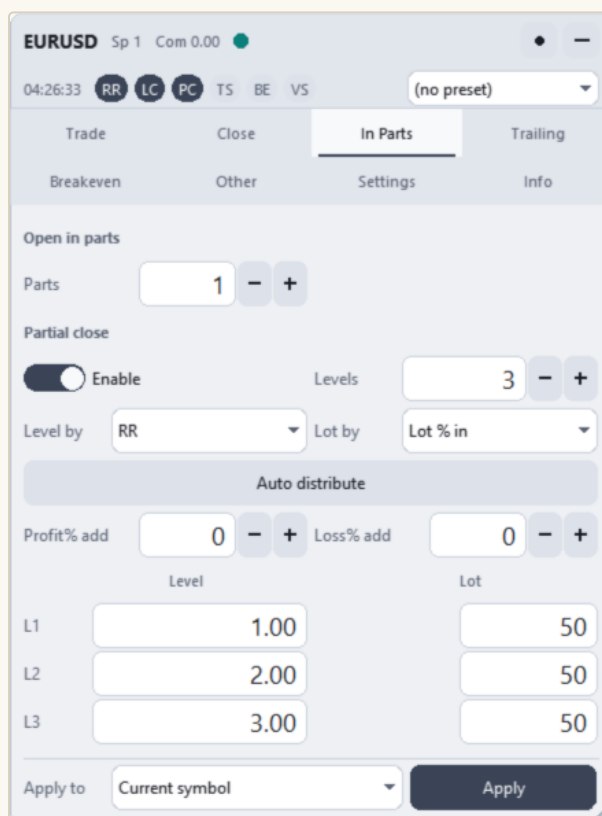


FIGURE 23 The In Parts tab (Slate theme)

8.1 Open in Parts

Parts splits the next order into that number of orders of equal size, rounded to the volume step; the remainder goes to the last part. On a hedging account each part becomes a separate position that you can manage on its own; on a netting account the parts merge into one position.

8.2 Partial Close

With **Enable** on, new positions close parts of their volume at up to ten levels.

A level is reached when the price at which a close would be executed (Bid for a buy, Ask for a sell) reaches it. Each level closes once per position, also after a restart, and at most one level closes per position at a time. Negative values place a level on the loss side. The levels are always calculated from the current settings and the current take profit of the position, so a change on this tab, or a moved take profit, applies to the levels that have not been reached yet.

8.3 Level Methods: Worked Examples

Example: a **buy of 1.00 lot at 1.10000** with a stop loss at **1.09800** (a risk of 200 points, 20 pips) and a take profit at **1.10600**, with three levels.

09 Trailing Tab

A trailing stop moves the stop loss behind the price as the trade moves in your favor.

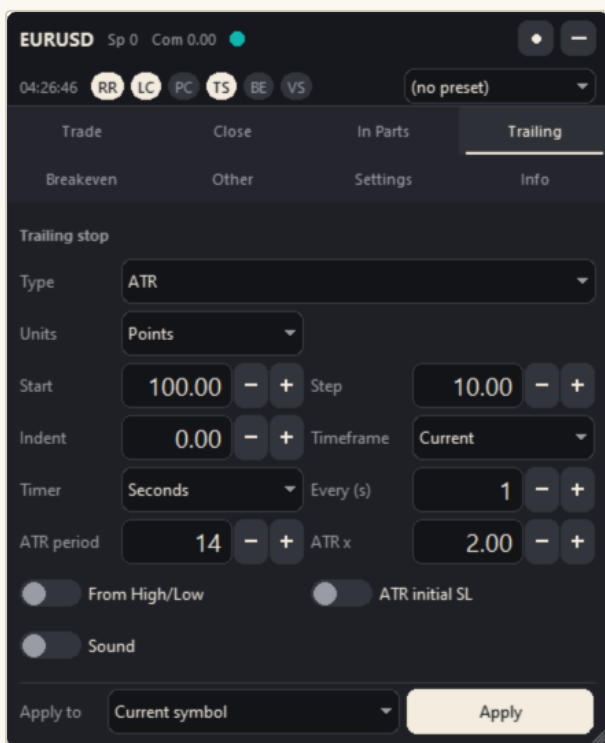


FIGURE 24 The Trailing tab with the ATR type (Dark theme)

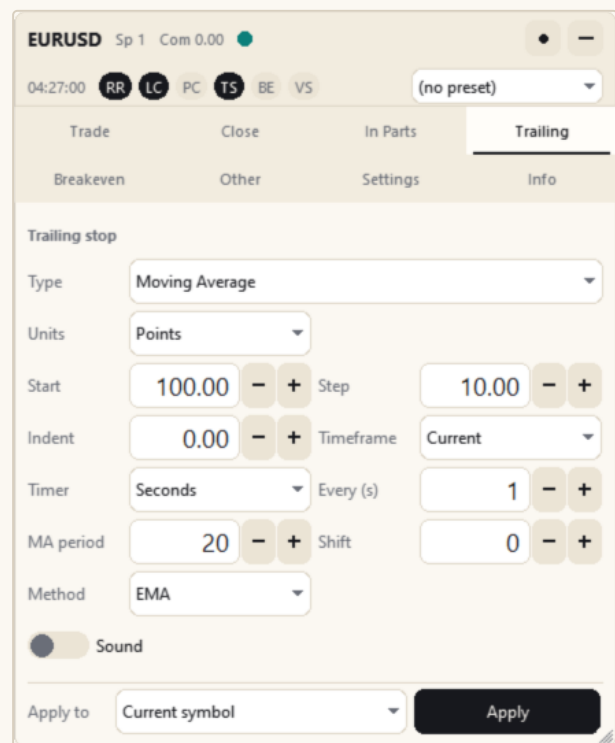


FIGURE 25 The Trailing tab with the Moving Average type (Light theme)

9.1 How Trailing Works

Every type calculates a reference level, subtracts the **Indent** (for a buy; for a sell it is added) and moves the stop loss there. Three rules apply to every type:

- Trailing starts only after the position has gained the **Start** distance, measured at the Bid price.
- The stop loss only moves forward, never back.

- The stop loss moves only when the new level is at least one **Step** better than the current one.

9.3 The Seven Trailing Types

The diagrams below use one synthetic price path (an illustration, not market data) and a buy position with its initial stop loss below the entry. The orange line is the stop loss and the teal line or markers show the reference level. Each trade ends where the price touches the trailed stop loss.

— Stop loss (only moves up for a buy) — Reference level — Entry ... Start level

Pips (fixed distance). The stop loss follows the price at a fixed distance. This type is simple and predictable; choose a distance larger than the usual pullbacks of the symbol.

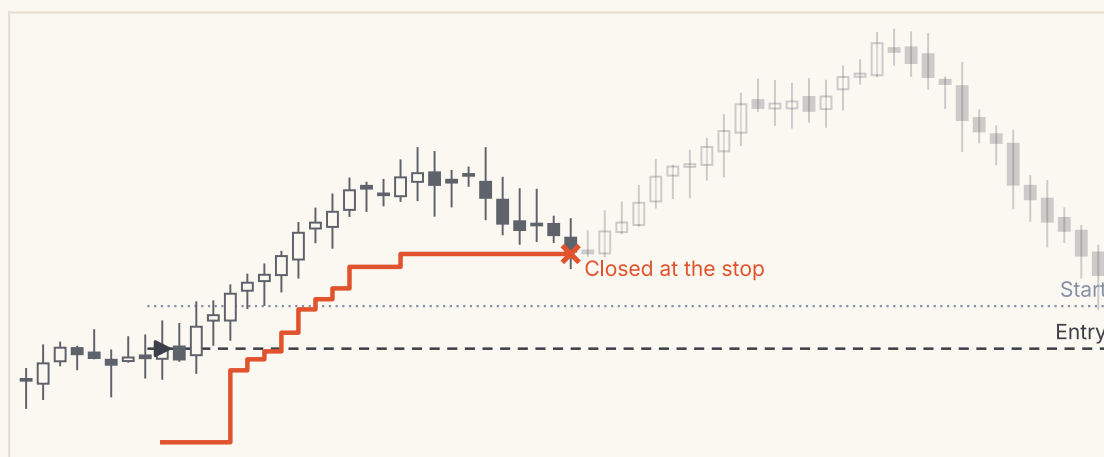


FIGURE 26 Pips: stop loss = price – distance (1.8 in this example)

Fractals. The stop loss moves to the last completed fractal below the price (above it for a sell). A fractal is complete once two bars have closed to its right, so the stop loss steps from one swing low to the next.

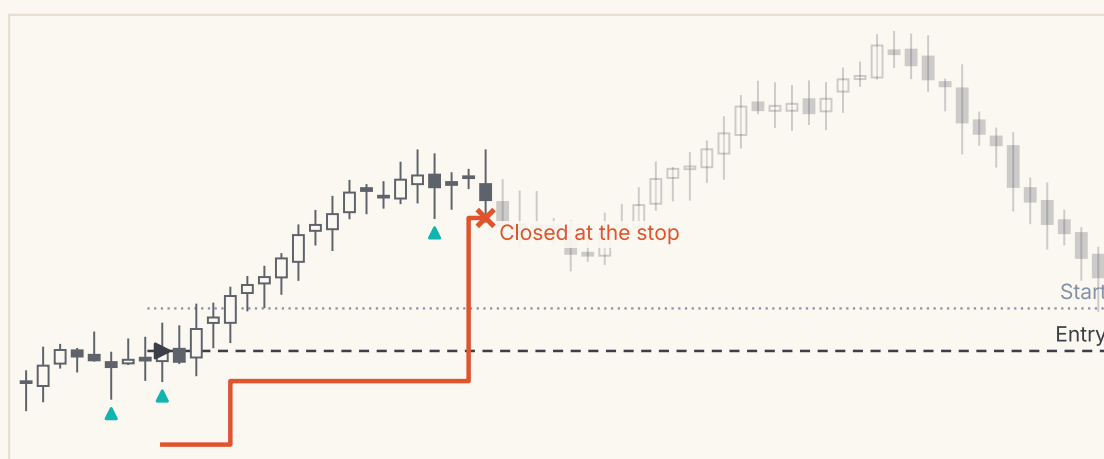


FIGURE 27 Fractals: stop loss = the last completed lower fractal

Moving Average. The stop loss follows the moving average of the last closed bar, as long as the average is below the price (above it for a sell).

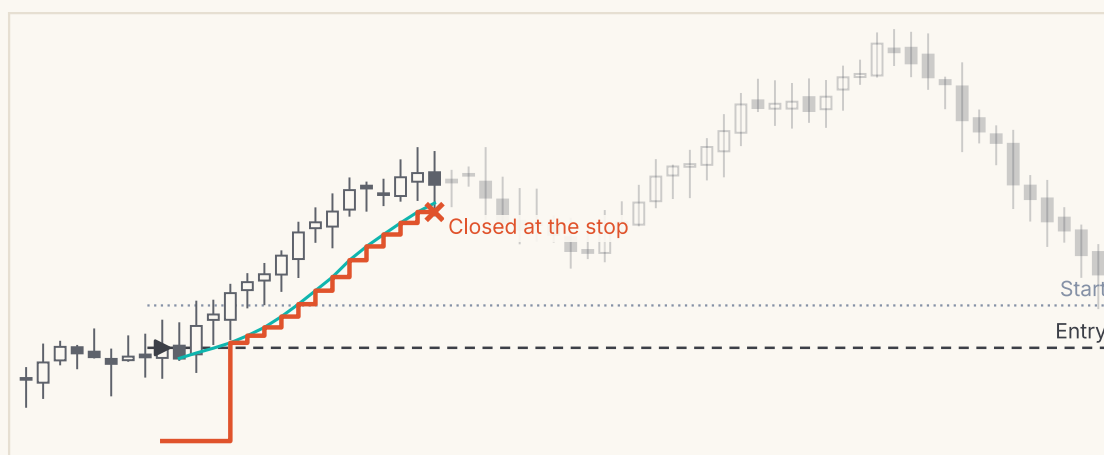


FIGURE 28 Moving Average: stop loss = MA(10) of the last closed bar

Parabolic SAR. The stop loss follows the SAR value of the last closed bar while it is on the correct side of the price.

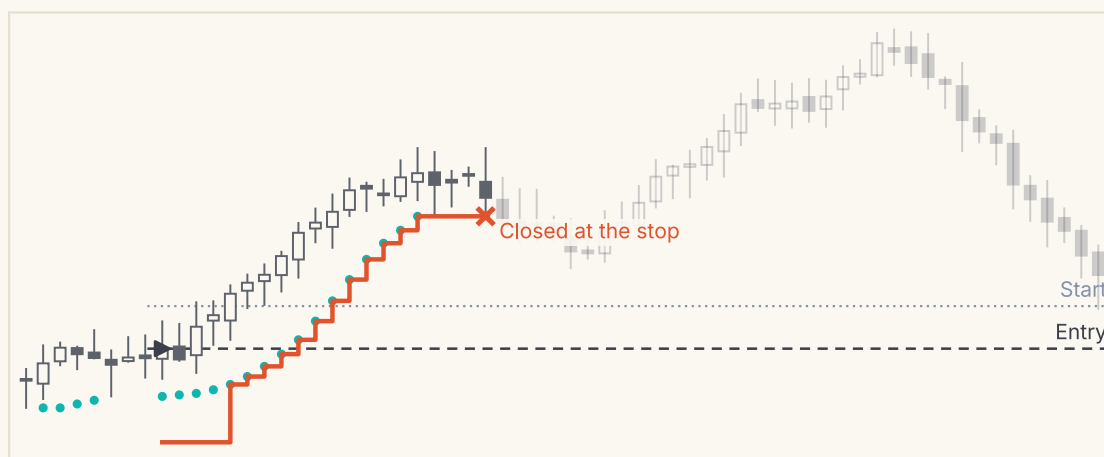


FIGURE 29 Parabolic SAR: stop loss = $\text{SAR}(0.02, 0.2)$ of the last closed bar

ATR. The stop loss stays $\text{ATR} \times \text{multiplier}$ below the price (or below the previous bar's high with **From High/Low**), so it widens in fast markets and tightens in quiet ones.

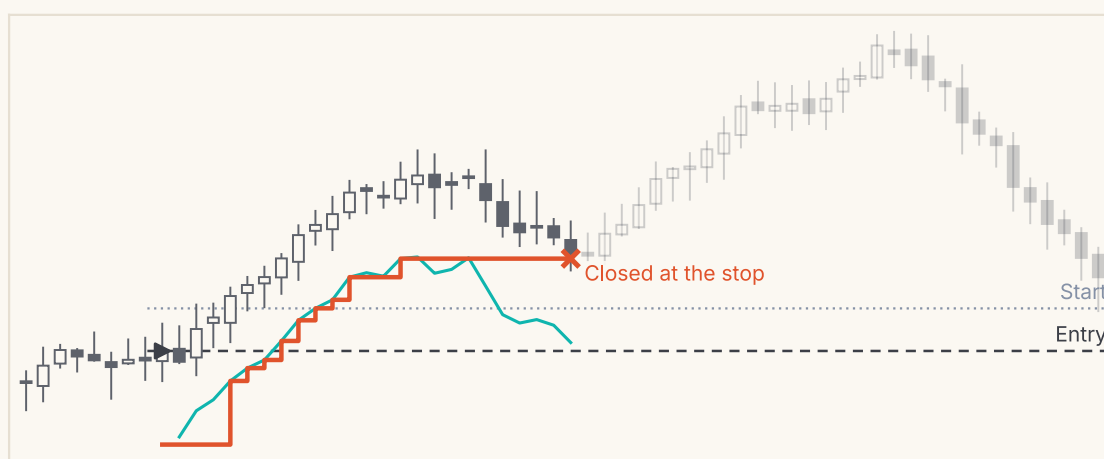


FIGURE 30 ATR: stop loss = $\text{price} - 2 \times \text{ATR}(10)$

Partial Close. After each partial close the stop loss moves to the price of that close, so every closed part secures the next part of the move. The type does nothing until the first partial close.

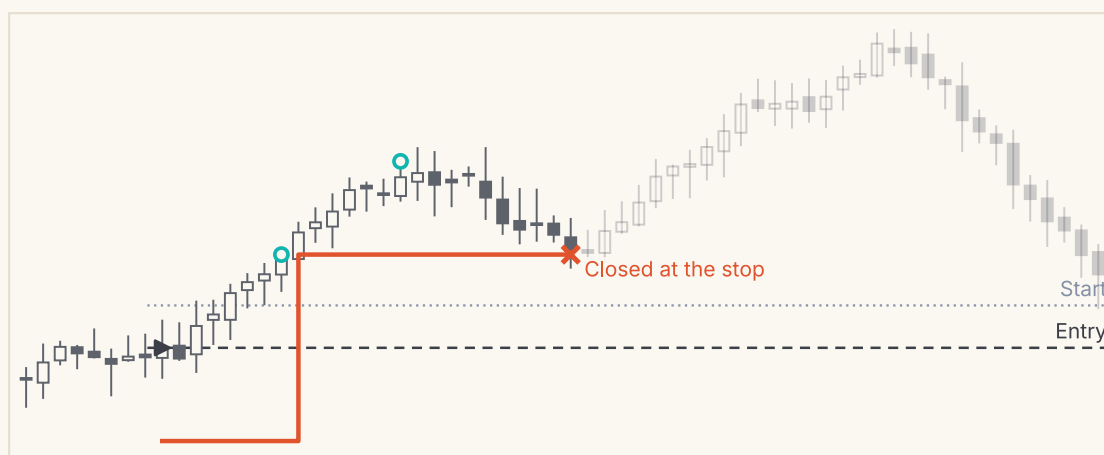


FIGURE 31 Partial Close: stop loss = the price of the last partial close

High/Low of the previous bar. The stop loss follows the low of the previous bar (the high for a sell). This is the tightest type and suits strong, fast moves.



FIGURE 32 High/Low: stop loss = the low of the previous bar

The indicator types (Fractals, Moving Average, Parabolic SAR, ATR and High/Low) read the chart's own price data, so with **Manage all symbols** they trail only the chart symbol; Pips and Partial Close trail every symbol.

10 Breakeven Tab

Breakeven moves the stop loss to the entry price, plus an offset, once the trade has moved far enough in your favor. It never moves a stop loss backwards.

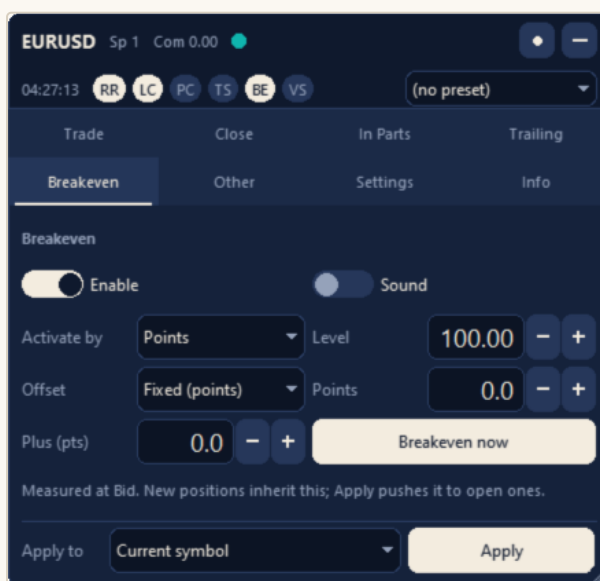


FIGURE 33 The Breakeven tab (Midnight theme)

Spread + commission covers the cost of the trade, so a position closed at breakeven ends close to zero instead of slightly negative.

11 Other Tab

The **Other** tab holds virtual orders and hidden stops, pending-order trailing, OCO, automatic order cancellation and the trade time manager.

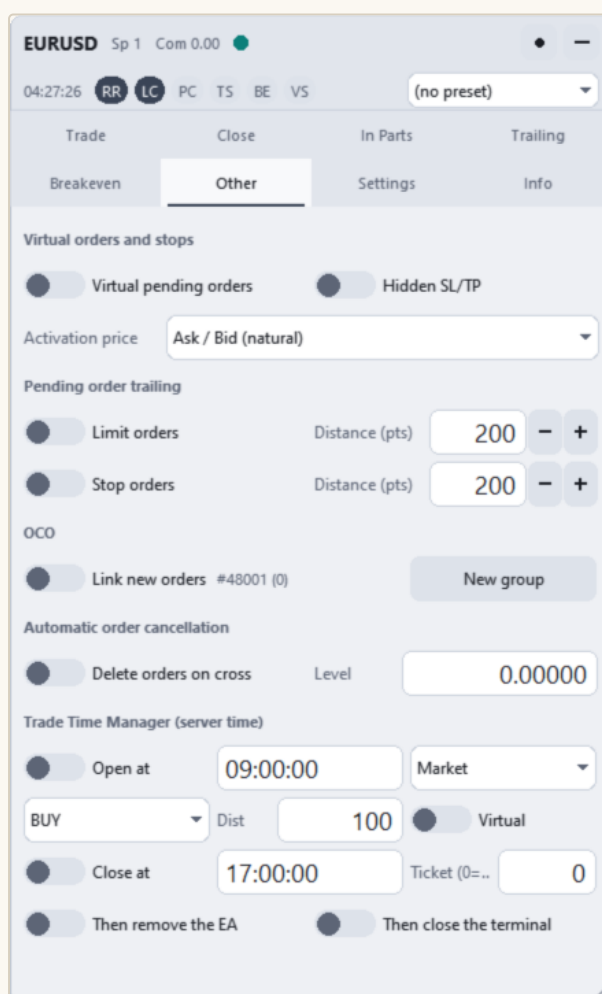


FIGURE 34 The Other tab (Slate theme)

Virtual orders appear as movable lines and hidden stops as `vSL #ticket` and `vTP #ticket` lines. Drag a hidden stop's line to move that position's stop. A hidden stop cannot be placed where the activation price has already reached it, because the EA would close the position at once: the line returns and a message explains why. A single position can be switched with **Hide SL/TP (virtual)** and **Restore real SL/TP** in its position menu. Virtual orders pass the same checks as a button press: a daily loss limit, a spread limit or a closed session holds the order, with a notice, until the block clears.

IMPORTANT

Virtual orders and hidden stops exist only inside the EA. They work only while the terminal is running and connected and the EA is attached. If the computer sleeps, the connection drops or the terminal is closed, a virtual order does not fire and a hidden stop does not close the position, and the broker holds no stop for it. The EA saves them and resumes after a restart, but it cannot act while it is not running. If you rely on them, run the terminal on a virtual private server (VPS).

11.2 Pending Order Trailing

Orders never move in the other direction, and their stop loss and take profit keep their distance to the order.

11.3 OCO (One Cancels the Other)

Link new orders (input `Inp_OCO_On`) puts the pending orders you place into one group: when one of them is filled, the others are deleted. **New group** starts a new group for the next orders; the label next to it shows the current group. A typical use is a Buy Stop above and a Sell Stop below a range, to trade a breakout in either direction.

11.4 Automatic Order Cancellation

Delete orders on cross and Level (inputs `Inp_V0_AutoCancelOn`, `Inp_V0_AutoCancelLevel`) delete every pending order when the price crosses this level, for example when a setup is no longer valid.

11.5 Trade Time Manager

All times are server times, as shown by the terminal's Market Watch.

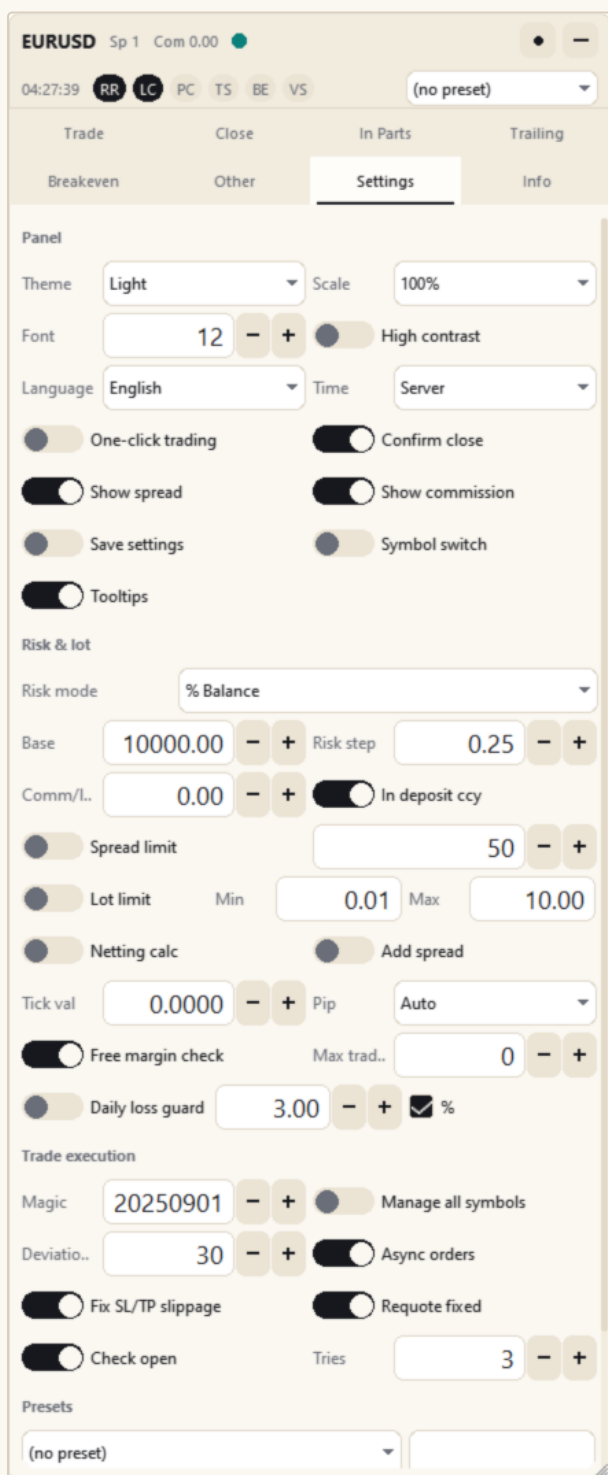


FIGURE 35 The Settings tab, top (Light theme)

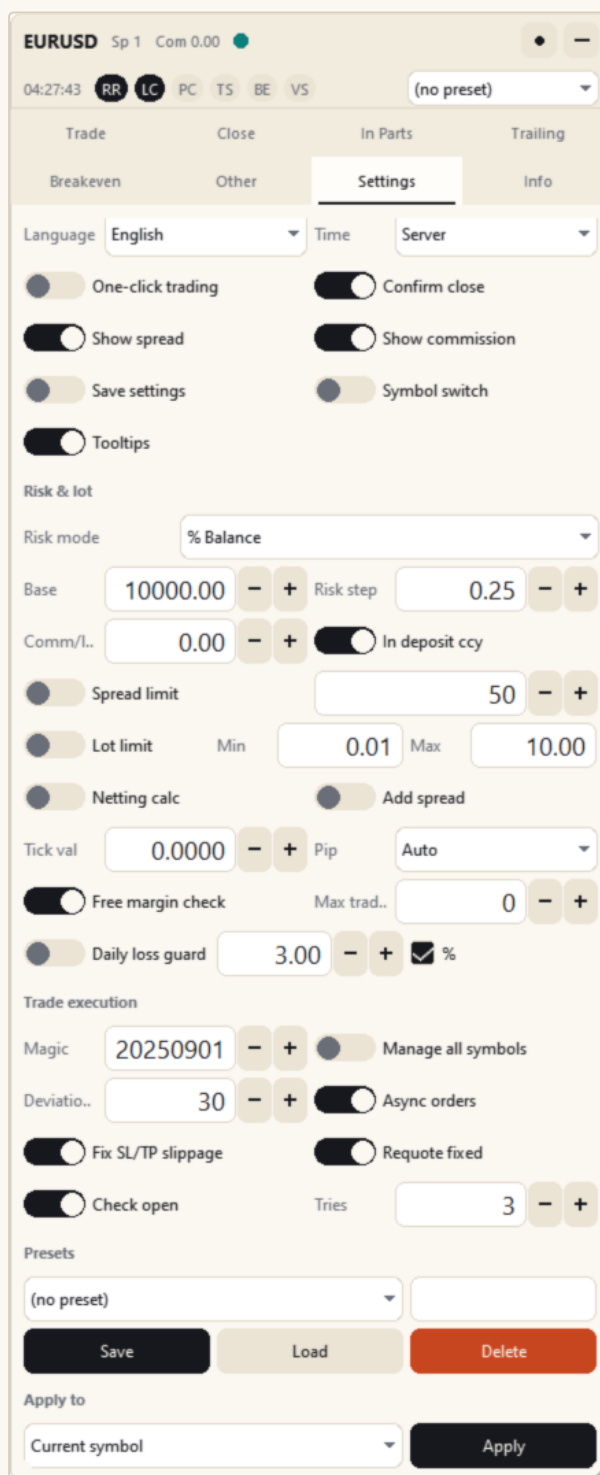


FIGURE 36 The Settings tab, scrolled to the presets and Apply

Type a name and press **Save** to store the current settings as a preset; choose a preset in the list and press **Load** or **Delete**. The preset list in the header loads a preset with one click. **Apply to** (current symbol, all positions or the selected positions) with **Apply** applies the current settings to positions that are already open.

13 Info Tab and Statistics

The **Info** tab shows facts about the symbol and the account, and statistics of the trades the EA manages.

- **Symbol:** Bid and Ask, spread, point cost and tick value, contract size, margin per lot and leverage, stop level and freeze level, swaps, volume limits and volume step.
- **Account:** login and server, hedging or netting and the account currency, balance and equity, free margin and margin level, stop-out level.
- **Statistics** for today, this week and this month, calculated from the account history for the closed positions the EA manages (its magic number and, unless **Manage all symbols** is on, the chart symbol):
 - **Trades** and **Win rate**;
 - **Net P/L:** profit, swap, commission and fees;
 - **Avg RR:** the average realized RR, that is, the profit divided by the initial risk recorded from the stop loss of the entry deal;
 - **Max DD:** the largest drawdown of the closed-trade equity curve.

The statistics refresh every 10 seconds while the **Info** tab is visible.

Export journal (CSV) writes the file `MT5\Files\StoplineTradeManager\Journal\<login>_trades.csv` (separator `;`) with the position ID, symbol, type, volume, entry and exit time and price, SL, TP, risk, profit, RR, status, comment and the screenshot files of each position.

14 Alerts and Notifications

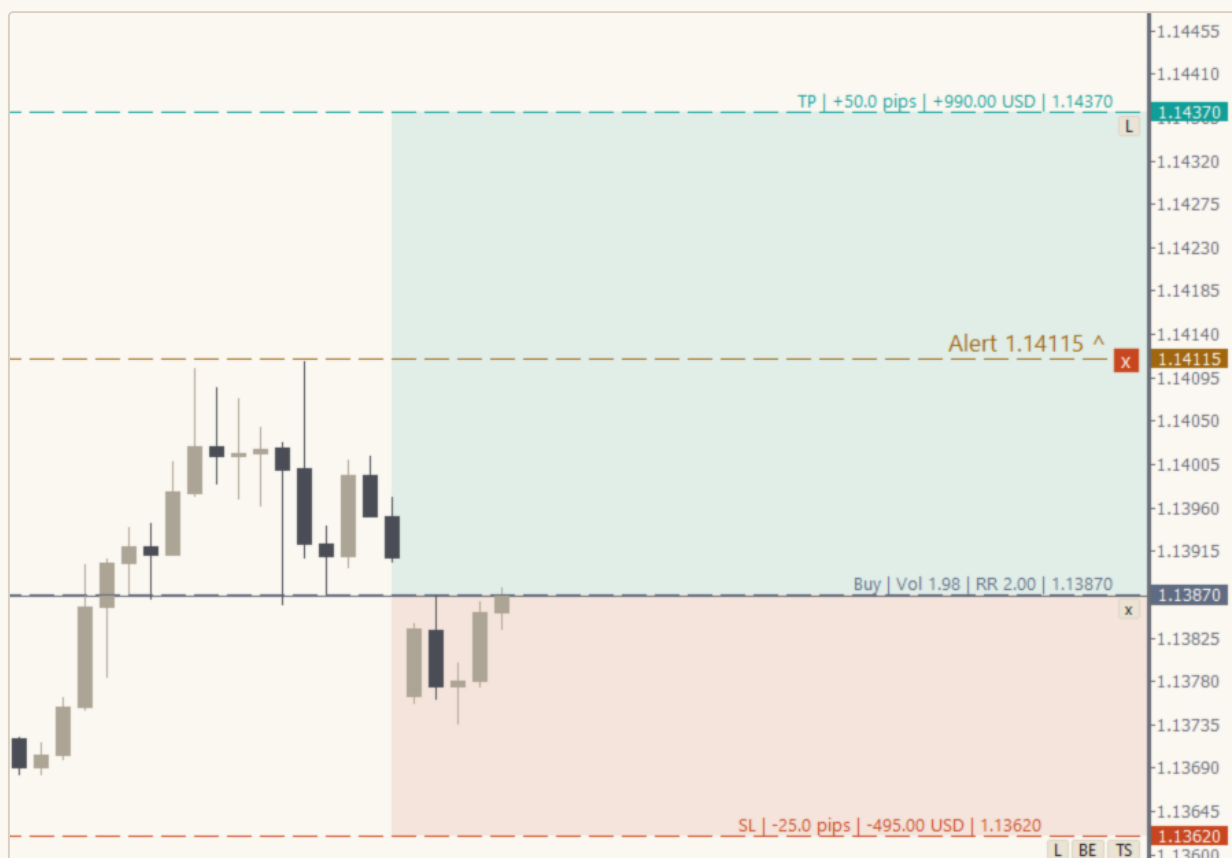


FIGURE 38 A price alert line between the entry and the take profit (Light theme)

- Price alerts.** The **!** button places an amber, dashed alert line a few pips above the market; **A** places it at the mouse pointer. Drag the line by its tab to the level you want (Section 6.1); **x** deletes it and **Shift+A** removes all alert lines. The alert fires when the Bid crosses the line. A price alert fires once and is removed after its last repetition.
- Your own lines.** With **Support / resistance line break alerts** on (input `Inp_Alert_LineBreak`), the horizontal lines and trend lines you draw yourself are watched too; they re-arm for the next break.
- Delivery.** The input `Inp_Alert_Type` is the sum of the methods you want: 1 pop-up, 2 sound, 4 push notification, 8 e-mail. The default, 3, is pop-up and sound. `Inp_Alert_MaxIterations` and `Inp_Alert_TimeoutSec` repeat the alert. Push notifications and e-mail need the **Notifications** and **Email** tabs of the terminal options.
- Per-symbol sound.** With **Per-symbol sound announcement** on, the alert plays `Sounds\TA<SYMBOL>.wav` (for example `Sounds\TA\EURUSD.wav`) if you add such a file, so you can hear which symbol is concerned (see Chapter 22).
- Show alert lines on all timeframes** keeps the lines visible on every timeframe.

Notifications. Short messages in the top-right corner of the chart (click one to dismiss it) report every action of the EA and every problem: trade errors, spread limit, maximum lot, a missing cross rate, Algo Trading off and the daily loss limit.

15 Screenshots and the Trade Journal

- **Shot** on the minimized toolbar, or **P**, saves a screenshot of the chart.
- **Automatic screenshots** (input `Inp_Shot_Auto`) takes one when a position is opened, closed or partially closed.
- The files are named `<SYMBOL>_<date>_<time>_<event>_<ticket>_<BUY|SELL>.png` and saved in `QL5\Files\Stopline Screenshots\` (input `Inp_Shot_Folder`). A caption in the **Screenshot caption color** is drawn on the picture; **Hide the terminal's deal arrows** removes the deal arrows.
- The journal export lists the screenshot files of each position, so a trading journal can link every trade to its pictures.

16 Hotkeys

Every hotkey is an input of the *Hotkeys* group and can be changed there. Write a key as **B**, **Shift** + **S**, **Ctrl** + **Shift** + **X**, **Num1**, **NumPlus** or **Shift** + **Up**; leave the input empty to turn the hotkey off. The terminal keeps every combination with Alt for itself, so no hotkey uses Alt. Hotkeys do nothing while an input field has the keyboard focus or a confirmation is open; **Esc** closes a dialog or menu and removes a field highlight.

17 Settings, Presets and Precedence

Settings come from three places:

1. **Inputs** (the EA dialog): the starting values.
2. **Saved settings**: with **Save settings** on, the panel remembers every change per symbol in the data folder.
3. **Presets**: named sets of settings that you save and load yourself.

Precedence. On a normal start (a restart of the terminal, a change of timeframe or a reinstallation of the same version) the saved settings take precedence over the inputs, so the panel returns as you left it. When you change inputs in the EA dialog, the inputs take precedence and overwrite the saved settings. With **Save settings** off, nothing is remembered and every start uses the inputs. Loading a preset replaces the current settings until you change them again.

Positions keep their own copies of their take-profit levels, the partial-close levels already reached, their hidden stops and whether breakeven, trailing and partial close are on for them. The levels and distances of breakeven, trailing and partial close come from the current settings, so a change on the panel also applies to the open positions that have the function on. **Apply** switches a function on or off for open positions. With **Save settings** off, a restart brings back the inputs and open positions follow those values; the EA then warns you when it starts with such positions.

18 Symbol Switching

Symbol switch in the **Settings** tab adds previous and next buttons to the header; **Shift + Right** and **Shift + Left** work without them. The symbols come from the Market Watch. **Switch every open chart** (input `Inp_Switch_AllCharts`) switches all open charts to the same symbol, and **Auto switch timer** (input `Inp_Switch_TimerSec`) changes the symbol every N seconds. The settings of each symbol are saved before every switch.

19 Hedging and Netting Accounts

The account type is shown on the **Info** tab.

- **Hedging** (several positions per symbol): every order opens a separate position with its own ticket, lines, take-profit levels, partial-close state and stops. **Parts** opens that number of positions.
- **Netting** (one position per symbol): a new deal merges into the existing position, and an opposite deal reduces or reverses it. **Netting calc** (beta) previews the merged lot and the average price before you send the order. After an addition, the merged position is the basis for partial-close percentages and RR-based levels.

20 Prop-Firm Setup

Many funded-account programs set a daily loss limit, a maximum loss and sometimes limits on the number of open trades or the lot size. The EA enforces the limits that you configure. It does not know the rules of your firm, so read them and set the guards with a safety margin.

- **Daily loss guard** (**Settings** tab; inputs `Inp_Risk_DailyLossOn`, `Inp_Risk_DailyLoss`, `Inp_Risk_DailyLossPct`): once the loss of the day reaches the limit, new entries are blocked until the next server day and the health dot turns orange. The loss of the day is the closed result of today plus the floating result of the open positions the EA manages. The limit is an amount in the account currency or a percentage of the current balance. The guard blocks new trades; it does not close open positions.
- Many firms measure the daily limit from the balance or the equity at the start of the day. Set the guard below the limit of your firm, and use **Total loss** on the **Close** tab to close everything when the floating loss reaches an amount.
- **Max trades** (input `Inp_Risk_MaxOpenTrades`): no new position once this number of positions is open.
- **Maximum exposure per symbol** (input `Inp_Risk_MaxExposureLots`): the lot of a new order is reduced so that the open volume of the symbol stays within the limit.
- **Lot limit (Min and Max)**: keeps every calculated lot within the range.
- **Risk mode** "percentage of the balance at the start of the previous day" keeps the risk base constant throughout the day.
- **Spread limit** and the input `Inp_Trade_TimeCheck` (trading session) keep orders out of wide spreads and closed sessions.

21 The Strategy Tester

The EA can be loaded in the Strategy Tester. In visual mode the panel and the lines are drawn, but the tester does not pass mouse clicks, drags or typing to an Expert Advisor, so the panel cannot be operated there; push notifications, e-mail alerts and the symbol switch are not available and the EA reports this. In a non-visual test the EA opens one BUY

position with the minimum volume, a stop loss and a take profit, and closes it one hour of test time later (after the session, guard and free-margin checks), because the automatic check of the MQL5 Market requires a trade operation.

22 Files and Folders

The EA stores its files in the data folder of the terminal. Open the data folder with **File > Open Data Folder** (**Ctrl** + **Shift** + **D**); on a Mac, see Section 2.11 for its place in Finder.

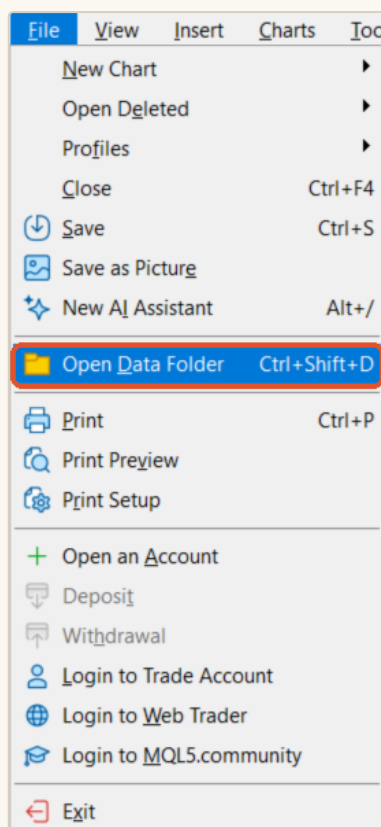


FIGURE 39 File > Open Data Folder

23 Troubleshooting

Symptom	Cause and Solution
The health dot is amber and the panel reports that Algo Trading is off.	Enable Algo Trading on the toolbar and Allow Algo Trading on the Common tab of the EA dialog.
The health dot is orange and the panel reports the daily loss limit.	The daily loss guard blocks new entries until the next day; turn the guard off in the Settings tab if you do not want it.
The health dot is orange and there is no connection.	The terminal is not connected to the trade server; check the connection status in the bottom-right corner of the terminal.
A line cannot be moved.	Point at the line until its tab appears, then drag the tab (Section 6.1). No tab appears over the panel or the line buttons, or when the input <code>Inp_Lines_Grips</code> is off; you can also double-click the line to select it and then drag it.
"No tick value / cross rate"	The terminal has no quote for the conversion pair yet. Open that symbol in the Market Watch, or set Tick val in the Settings tab.
"Risk too small for the minimum lot"	Raise the risk or widen the stop. The EA never rounds a lot up above your risk, except when Lot limit Min sets a minimum, which the plan states.
BUY and SELL are unavailable.	A pending order type is selected. Set the type to Market or press M .

Logs. The **Experts** tab of the terminal's **Toolbox** shows what the EA does. With the input `Inp_Sys_LogToFile` on, it also writes `ML5\Files\StoplineTradeManager\Logs\<SYMBOL>.log`; the input `Inp_Sys_LogLevel` sets the detail.

Pip	10 points on symbols with 3 or 5 digits, otherwise 1 point (Pip in the Settings tab).
Point	The smallest price step of a symbol, for example 0.00001 for EURUSD quoted with five digits.
Preset	A named set of settings that you can save and load.
Risk	The money lost if the stop loss is reached: lot × stop distance × value per point, plus commission and, with Add spread , the spread.

Spread	The difference between Ask and Bid.
